Since then Charlie has blossomed into an award-winning anti-bullying ambassador and activist, who uses the lessons from his own journey to inspire other children to accept themselves for who they are. He is the founder of the Charlie Kristensen Foundation, a charity that provides antibullying resources to young people and teachers, and empowers schools and other establishments to foster kindness, care, acceptance and inclusion within their communities.


About the poets:


