We are open every day except Bank Holidays, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

Monday 9am - 6pm Tuesday 9am - 6pm Wednesday 9am - 6pm Thursday 9am - 6pm Friday 9am - 6pm Saturday 9am - 5pm Sunday 10am - 4pm

The **quietest time** to visit is at the start of the day.



Tuesday and Thursday mornings can be noisy as we have **Rhyme Time** for young children outside Children's Library.

The Welcome Hall










The Welcome Hall is an echoey space.

The **Temporary Exhibition** has a different exhibition three times a year.

The **Workroom** gallery celebrates historical local industries. People often work in here on their laptops.


First Floor Museum Galleries

Libraries
















The **Children's Library** is on the ground floor.

Events sometimes take place in the evenings too.





Useful Places





There are two main flights of stairs between the ground floor and the first floor.





There are toilets and baby changing facilities both on the ground floor and first floor.





There is a large buggy park on the ground floor.

Emergency evacuation





If you hear the fire alarm, you will need to leave the building straight away.
